Swiss Roll Recipe for Division H, Class 9

Ingredients:

Butter, to grease 4oz (125g) golden caster sugar

3 large eggs 4oz (125g) plain flour

4oz (125g) jam, warmed Extra caster sugar and plain flour to dust

Method:

- 1. Grease and line a $13'' \times 9''$ (33 x 23cm) Swiss roll tin; grease the paper. Dust with caster sugar and flour.
- 2. Put the eggs and sugar in a large heatproof bowl and whisk until well blended using a hand-held electric whisk. Put the bowl over a pan of hot water and whisk until the mixture is pale and creamy, and thick enough to leave a trail on the surface when the whisk is lifted. Remove bowl from pan and whisk until cool and thick.
- Sift half the flour over the mixture and fold in very lightly using a large metal spoon or spatula. Sift in the remaining flour and gently fold in until evenly incorporated. Carefully fold in 1 tbsp hot water.
- 4. Pour into the prepared tin and tilt the tin backwards and forwards to spread the mixture evenly. Bake at 180C (fan oven) mark 6 for 10-12 minutes until pale golden, risen and springy to the touch.
- 5. Meanwhile, put a sheet of greaseproof paper on a damp tea-towel. Dredge the paper with caster sugar.
- Quickly turn out the cake on to the paper and remove the lining paper. Trim off the crusty edges and spread the cake with jam.
- 7. Roll up the cake from a short side, with the aid of the paper. Make the first turn firmly so that the cake will roll evenly and finish with a good shape, but roll more lightly after this turn. Put seam-side down on a wire rack and sprinkle with sugar to serve.

Rules

- 1. Classes are open to all irrespective of place of residence.
- 2. The awarding of Affiliated Society Medals is subject to the Societies' own Rules.
- 3. Exhibitors are restricted to one entry per class.
- 4. Vases and containers are to be provided by the exhibitors.
- 5. All exhibits in Divisions A to F (incl.) shall be from plants, etc., which have been the exclusive property of the exhibitor for at least two months prior to the Show. All exhibits in Divisions G to Q (incl.) must be the **exhibitor's own work.**
- 6. Items exhibited in Divisions J to L (incl.) must not have been exhibited in previous Bathampton Village Shows.
- Adult classes are 15 years and above. Under 15 years are restricted to classes N, O, P & O.
- 8. All entry forms, including postal entries, with fees, and online entries with corresponding bank transfer must be received by 1pm on Wednesday 10th September 2025. Irrespective of the amount of entrance fee paid, no exhibit will be accepted unless the Class number is clearly marked on the entry form. Late entries will not be accepted.
- 9. In order to be satisfied that the conditions governing competitive exhibits are fulfilled, the Show Committee reserves the right to visit by commission before or after a Show, gardens and/or allotments from which plants, flowers, fruit or vegetables have been entered for competitions.
- 10. Exhibits may be staged on Friday 12th September 2025 between 5.30pm and 9.00pm and between 7.00am and 9.30am on Saturday 13th September 2025. All exhibitors must vacate the premises by 9.45am on the morning of the Show.
- 11. The Committee reserve the right to remove any entries that exceed the maximum size allowable for the relevant class.
- 12. Judging will commence at 9.45am on Saturday 13th September 2025. Judges' decisions shall be final.
 - Only one certificate for 1st, 2nd and 3rd and respective prize money will be awarded per Class as detailed in the Schedule.
- 13. Single entries in a class will be judged on merit and placed accordingly.
- 14. Any objection to be lodged with the Chief Steward in writing with a deposit of £2.00 before 3.30pm on the day of the Show. The deposit will be refunded if the objection is sustained.

- 15. No exhibit to be removed until after Prize Giving on Show day. All exhibits must be cleared by 5.30pm. All exhibits left after 5.30pm will be collected and made available to purchase for a donation.
- 16. All trophies are perpetual and remain the property of the Show Committee. Trophies are to be returned to the Trophy Secretary no later than 16th July 2026 prior to the next Show.
- 17. The Show Committee cannot accept responsibility for any loss or damage.
- 18. The Show Committee reserve the right to move exhibits if there is overcrowding or inconvenience. Exhibitors must not handle other exhibits but should contact a steward if it is necessary to move exhibits.
- 19. All prize money to be collected from the Information Stand after the Prize Giving Ceremony. Prizes not claimed within 7 days will be forfeited.
- 20. The Show Committee's interpretation of the above Rules shall be final and binding.
- 21. Exhibitors are asked to name the varieties of their exhibits, where possible, in the interest of the general public.
- 22. **The use of floral oasis is banned in all classes.** If any oasis is found to have been used the entry will be disqualified. Suggested alternatives are TerraBrick, watermelon, chicken wire, stones, compacted moss or straw. These are suggestions only, more may be found online (RHS website).
- 23. Name of exhibitor must not be on display when exhibits are staged.
- 24. A separate entry form must be completed by each exhibitor. Entry forms with multiple exhibitors will not be processed.


